

2 to 3 Years

Understanding and Hearing

- Understands differences in meaning ("go-stop," "in-on," "big-little").
- O Notices sounds (telephone ringing, television sounds, knocking at the door).
- O Follows two requests ("Get the book and put it on the table.").

Talking

- Has a word for almost everything.
- O Uses two-three-word "sentences" to talk about and ask for things.
- O Speech is understood by familiar listeners most of the time.

3 to 4 Years

Understanding and Hearing

- O Hears you when you call from another room.
- O Hears television or radio at the same loudness level as other family members.
- Understands simple, "who," "what," "where" questions.

Talking

- O Talks about activities at school or at friends' homes.
- O Usually talks easily without repeating syllables or words.
- O People outside family usually understand child's speech.
- O Uses many sentences with four or more words.
